Dear Parishioners,

Parenting has been described, maybe somewhat cynically, as feeding the hand that bites you. Nothing wounds deeper than ingratitude, particularly in families and among friends. The word "thanks" can mean so much and yet all of us have experienced ingratitude or lack of appreciation at many times in our lives. Today, we are challenged to think about gratitude, appreciation and thankfulness. The first reading from the Book of Kings tells of Naaman the Syrian. We are not given the full story, but just part of the ending, when Naaman has already been healed of his leprosy and wants to thank the prophet Elisha. Elisha refuses the gift because only God can be thanked for such a wonderful miracle.

In the Scriptures and leprosy is often seen as a symbol for sinfulness and in that sense, all of us are lepers in need of healing, but sometimes, we can become lax in our awareness of sin because so much of our modern culture denies that there is any sin. With little reflection, most of us soon realise that all of us are sinners and we haven't responded fully to God's call in our lives.

The Gospel story reminds us of the importance of being grateful for the many healings we have experienced in our lives. When we take time to reflect, we can come to appreciate how God is present in all of our lives. Sometimes, we can go through life in the way that children go through birthday presents. We tear through the wrapping paper of our gifts without taking time to savour and appreciate all we have been given. If we take the time to recall the Lord's goodness, then our hearts will be filled with a sense of gratitude and joy.

So our readings today invite us to take time to reflect on the presence of God in our lives and to be aware of his effect in our lives. We are invited to take time to know the "goodness of the Lord" and to give thanks for his goodness to each one of us.
