SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Reflection

Dear Parishioners.

John the Baptist grabs our attention in todays Gospel, as he appears in the desert in his garment of camel hair, eating locusts and wild honey. As he preaches a message of repentance, crowds of people gather round him, being baptised and confessing their sins. He's a peculiar mixture of signs and messages, even to the people of the time who were on the lookout for a prophetic figure.

Sometimes a persons lifestyle can offer an even more powerful witness than their words. John's basic diet and dress suggest a lifestyle that is simple and radical and it challenged the norms of the day. He reminds us of another man who catches our attention with his simple lifestyle. Pope Francis continues to challenge us by many of the decisions that he makes and especially by his very moderate and simple lifestyle and we continue to be challenged by the great witness that he gives.

While we mightn't be called to the desert life, we're challenged to examine our values and our relationship with material things – an apt message as we enter what can be a very materialistic season for many. John the Baptist's message can be summed up by the first word that he speaks: repent. The Greek word for "repentance" is metanoia which means a change of heart! On a different note, as we approach the great feast of Christmas, I'm conscious that there has been much debate about drink driving, speed regulations and traffic safety, while television campaigns confront us with horrific images of road carnage and the terrible lifelong consequences of such tragedies. The truth is that each of us has a responsibility to take care on the roads whether we are the cyclist, motorist or pedestrian. In the lead up to Christmas, it might mean slowing down, taking extra time and being courteous to other road users in order to save life. While it is true that some accidents cannot be avoided, it is also true that many can. Let us give a gift this Christmas to somebody, who might not even know we are giving it to them. By taking more care on the roads, let us offer to somebody, maybe even somebody close

to us, maybe even to ourselves, the greatest gift of all – the gift of life. Finally, I want to highlight that this year, the 11pm Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve in St Patrick's

Cathedral will be a Eurovision Broadcast. The Mass will be broadcast live across Ireland and across a number of European countries. It's a wonderful privilege to have been given this opportunity, for many people across Europe to be able to join in celebrating the Feast of the Nativity, live from our beautiful Cathedral. It's hoped that a large number of our parishioners will join in person for the Mass, as people join with us via television across Europe. All who are attending the Mass will have to be seated by 10.40pm and the celebration will conclude at 12 midnight.
