Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection

Dear Parishioners,

The teaching in today's Gospel isn't easy; it can be difficult enough to love our friends and members of our own families, but "to love our enemies, to pray for those who persecute us and to turn the other cheek" is a huge challenge. It goes against our natural instincts and it goes against everything that Jesus was taught as a child. With the people of his day, it was very clearly "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth". The Jewish system of justice was arbitrary and ruthless as we witness in gospel stories where women were stoned to death or men found guilty of other crimes were tortured and crucified as a public spectacle. The teaching of Jesus is clearly opposed to all of that.

Yet Christianity doesn't ask us to be doormats so that people can walk over us; it doesn't ask us to be wimps. Through the power of God's Spirit within us, we're asked to become strong and brave, because it requires great strength of character and great single-minded resolve to forgive those who hurt us, or to turn the other cheek to those who offend us. Today Jesus asks us "to offer no resistance to the wicked man, to pray for those who persecute you and to love your enemies". We must never forget that by ourselves and of ourselves, we just don't have what it takes to do what Jesus asks. There are times when the hurts are too deep, and the experience is too recent, to be able even to consider forgiveness. That's why we often pray that the Holy Spirit will "enkindle within us the fire of divine love" and to give us a willingness to want to forgive. When it comes to forgiveness, this is one area where we really need the Spirit to enter and to act. It requires a heart which we may not yet possess to be able to forgive and forget.

The truth is that when I do forgive someone, both of us are set free and it's important to keep in mind that there's a wonderful freedom in having a forgiving heart.

On a different note, the Sunday before Ash Wednesday is Temperance Sunday and It's a good time to reflect on our lifestyle, our social activities, the way we spend money, the habits of indulgence and the various addictions that can take hold of our lives. Perhaps it's a good time to think about a few terms that nowadays might be considered unpopular and even old fashioned eg self-denial, personal sacrifice, abstinence, self-discipline and penance. On Temperance Sunday, we're encouraged to think about the importance of being temperate in all things, not just in relation to our consumption of food and drink. Today we acknowledge in a special way the members of the Pioneer Total Abstinence Association and we thank them particularly for their fidelity and for the example of their lives.
