Dear Parishioners.

From our own experience of coping sometimes with the strange ways of God, we might be able to relate to Martha's sense of disappointment and possible frustration as mentioned in today's Gospel. What was the tone in her voice and what were the feelings in her heart when she left the house and went out to meet Jesus? Is there a hint of anger? Is she blaming Jesus for not coming sooner? "If you had been here, my brother would not have died...." Do we sometimes blame God when our plans don't materialise or when we don't seem to get the answers we expect?

The incident in today's Gospel reminds us that God has a purpose that may not always be very evident. We are told that at the sight of Martha's tears and those of her friends, Jesus was deeply moved. In one of the shortest sentences in the New Testament, we get a glimpse of his compassion: "Jesus wept". We can only imagine what must have been the thoughts of the people when he asked that the stone be taken away from the opening of the cave where the body of Lazarus had been buried four days earlier. Did they suspect that Jesus was so overwhelmed with grief that he might be deranged? And what was their reaction when he cried out in a loud voice: "Lazarus, here! Come out!"? Again we can only imagine their sense of terror and awe when the dead man emerged from the tomb. And what did they think as they unwrapped the bands of burial cloths so that he could go free?

The raising of Lazarus from the dead is a very powerful story. During this fifth week of Lent, the same Lord calls each one of us to roll back the stone and come out of the tomb, the place of death and darkness. He invites us to step out of the tomb of our selfishness and fear. He wants to unbind us from all forms of bondage so that we can be free.

We might feel it is too late to change. We might argue that we have been so long in the grave of our mediocrity and sin that we couldn't possibly transform our ways. And yet we must recall that it was not by his own strength that Lazarus returned to life, but through the power of God. It is this same power that calls us and enables us to break out of the fetters of selfishness so that we can serve our neighbour and our God in a new life of generous love. Now is an opportunity for us to hear his call and to receive his power to be changed to a better life.
