Third Sunday of Easter Reflection

Dear Parishioners,

Today we accompany two of the disciples on their way to Emmaus and eavesdrop on their conversation with a stranger who joins them en route. They're leaving Jerusalem where everything went wrong and all of their dreams were shattered. It's understandable that they want to get away from the place of failure and disappointment. Feeling lost and disillusioned, their faces are downcast, their hearts are heavy and sad. While we don't have much detail about the two individuals in question, this story is regarded as a masterpiece in terms of conversation and conversion, moving as it does from utter despondency to total enthusiasm. When they eventually recognise the stranger as the Risen Lord, the two disciples wonder to themselves: "Did not our hearts burn within us?" And in the end, we find them on their way back to Jerusalem filled with fresh hope.

There are many layers of meaning and countless depths of significance contained in this particular story which has bemused theologians and scripture scholars for generations. What happened on the road to Emmaus could also be linked to our celebration of the Eucharist; there is interplay between the two events with certain elements of the Gospel story reflected in various components of the Mass.

Firstly, there is the encounter with the Lord in the guise of a stranger. Every gathering of the community for Mass is an encounter with the Lord. The community is already the Body of Christ. The Lord is present when two or three gather in his name.

In the Penitential Rite, the gathered community acknowledges its need for God's mercy and healing, much like the two disciples expressing their disillusionment and sense of hopelessness as they reflect on recent events.

There is the Liturgy of the Word as Jesus breaks open the Scriptures, explains its full meaning with regard to himself and leaves their hearts on fire with enthusiasm.

There is also the remembering of the sacrificial death of Jesus which is at the heart of every Eucharist.

There is the breaking of the bread by which the community recognises the living presence of the Lord in each one and the unity of that binds them together as the Body of Christ.

Finally there is there is the desired conclusion of every Eucharist – the urge to go out and share the experience of knowing and loving Jesus as Lord and inviting others to share that experience.

"Lord, stay with us on our journey. Touch our lives and make our hearts burn within us so that we may recognise you in your Word and in the Breaking of Bread."
