THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD Reflection

We are familiar with the frequently used saying "to come full circle", which means that people, having set out on a journey or task, have returned to where they started. This applies particularly to our thoughts about Jesus on the Feast of the Ascension. In one sense, the Ascension celebrates that Jesus has come full circle because, having come

In one sense, the Ascension celebrates that Jesus has come full circle because, having come from the Father to accomplish a specific mission, he returns to the Father having achieved what he was sent to do: to save us from spiritual death and alienation from God due to our sins.

But in another sense, the Ascension marks the passing on of the baton by Jesus to his apostles. At the beginning of his public ministry, he had preached that the kingdom of heaven was close and he had challenged people to repent of their sins and believe in the Good News. Now the responsibility for that ministry was being passed on to the apostles and disciples. They were mandated to continue Jesus' saving work, drawing all nations to the truth of the Gospel. Jesus' departure from the earth and his return to heaven did not mean that his apostles and disciples would remain alone in their mission. Although he would no longer be physically present, he told them, "And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time". So there was no need for them to worry or to be lacking in confidence because he would be spiritually present, especially in the sacramental life of the Church. He also promised to send the Holy Spirit who would guide them in their various activities.

The message of the Ascension is clear. The saving work of Christ is now being handed over to the Church. The baton is being passed on to us. Just as in a relay race, it is imperative that we do not drop the baton. In other words, the responsibility for passing on the faith rests with us. We carry the faith with courage and conviction and we pass it on to those we meet.

Today also marks the 57th World Communications Day, and the theme for this year is Speaking with the heart "the truth in love". In writing for today, Pope Francis tells us that we should never be afraid of proclaiming the truth, even if it is at times uncomfortable. We're all called to seek and to speak the truth and to do so with charity.

It is fitting that World Communications Day coincides with the Feast of the Ascension when Jesus entrusts his disciples with the important task of spreading the Good News – "to make disciples of all the nations". The way we communicate and the news we choose to share with others is an important part of our role as disciples.

150th Anniversary of the Dedication of St Patrick's Cathedral This year is a very special year in the history of our Parish as we celebrate the 150th Anniversary of the Dedication of St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh. The Cathedral was dedicated by Dr Daniel McGettigan, former Archbishop of Armagh on 24 August 1873. Over twenty thousand people gathered on & around the hill on that historic occasion. We thank God for our Cathedral Church & for the great house of prayer that it is. We give thanks for being able to celebrate the Mother Church of our diocese during these weeks. An exhibition on the Cathedral is taking place at present. thanks to all the in the different schools in our parish for all their research & hard work. People are encouraged to visit the Cathedral & see the fruits of the children's work!

Thurs 25 May An invitation to all Mothers & Grandmothers in the Archdiocese of Armagh. 7pm: Evening Prayer followed by a presentation on the history of St Patrick's Cathedral (not live streamed). Refreshments to follow in The Synod Hall. All Mothers & Grandmothers are asked to bring a piece of cloth, 8in by 8in, which symbolise their many crosses in life. These will be pieced together to create a special Diocesan Tapestry, which will acknowledge their pain & suffering of the past but also their hopes for the future!

Sun 11 – Tues 13 June A first class relic of Blessed Carlo will visit the Cathedral. Blessed Carlo was beatified by Pope Francis in Assisi in October 2020. His friends remember him as a young dreamer, service-oriented and full of charisma. He died in 2006, at only 15 years of age, after a battle with leukaemia. His life may have been short but it made a huge impact. Recently, in the process for the teenager's beatification, his tomb became a real pilgrimage site.
