Reflection

Dear Parishioner

I'm so conscious of the words of St Thérèse of Lisieux today when she said that "the Rosary is a long chain that links heaven to earth - at one end is our hands and at the other, the hands of God".

This month we celebrate 'Mission' and we are reminded that the mission of the Church and by extension, our mission, is to spread the good news to all. In today's Gospel we hear the parable of the two sons, the first is reluctant but still humbly does the will of the father while the second is all talk but actually doesn't put his words into action. Today as we think of missionaries who left these shores to travel to many countries of the world sharing the 'Good News' we are encouraged to ask ourselves whether we are living up to our mission.

At the moment of our baptism and again each time we come to Mass we are sent as disciples to bring the joy and hope of the Gospel to the community, to our families and friends, to our homes and our hearts. This is a big challenge when we live in a world where secular ideas surround us and where so many face persecution for their faith, but it is possible.

We can all witness as missionaries to the message of faith, hope and love by our little acts of kindness. Indeed even simple words and phrases like 'God bless', 'thank God' or 'please God' can impact those who we speak with.

Like so many missionaries the Rosary acts as a great tool to bring people closer to God - as Our Lady points towards her Son in the meditations on the mysteries. October, being the month of the Rosary, is a lovely opportunity to renew our practice of praying the Rosary, as a faith community, as a family or united with the global church in personal prayer. Growing up in Dundalk I remember how we had a great devotion to the Rosary and it is a prayer that I have prayed during many of the most challenging moments of my life - I thank God for those who handed on the faith to me as I am sure we all do.

Maybe October is a month where we could pass on a 'Rosary beads' to someone we care about - maybe we could let them know that we care enough about them to bless them with the blessings we receive from our faith. This is 'Mission' - passing on to our loved ones the faith which is precious to us. To do so with confidence knowing that it is precious - oftentimes we only know how precious when we are at the most difficult moments in life - these are the moments God carries us.

Next Week - from Thursday to Saturday (October 5th to 7th) we will celebrate a Triduum of Prayer in honour of Our Lady of the Rosary. We will collectively pray for the intentions of our parish and pray for a renewal of faith, hope and love. Fr Colm Mannion OP will lead our triduum and I encourage you to spread the word and invite those who you care about to take part - on Saturday we will have the "Mass of Anointing of the Sick" at 10am in the Cathedral. Maybe our 'mission' this week is to invite someone to take part in the 3 days of prayer. You might be surprised by the little miracles that can happen from a simple invitation!
