Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is a significant feast, as it invites us to recall our own baptism—the moment we were welcomed into the family of faith and began our journey of aligning our lives with God's loving plan for us. When Jesus was baptised by John in the River Jordan, he heard the voice of the Father declaring him as Son. In the same way, through our baptism, we are brought into relationship with God as his sons and daughters, chosen and called to be witnesses of his love in the world.

Our parish is very blessed with many baptisms each year, and we thank God for the renewal of faith that comes through new members of the Church. This celebration also encourages us to reflect on our own baptism and to give thanks for all those who were present at that moment—our parents and godparents, grandparents, extended family, the priest/deacon, and the wider parish community—each of whom supported us in the early steps of our faith journey. The Sacrament of Confirmation is closely linked to Baptism, as it is the moment when we personally affirm the profession of faith once made on our behalf. With this in mind, I invite every parishioner this weekend to renew that commitment and to recommit ourselves to serving God and our neighbours in faith.

As our Archdiocese prepares to gather for the Congress on Family, Faith and Youth this coming March, I again invite you to reflect on ways you might encourage family members and younger people in our community to reconnect with the faith. This might be through a personal invitation, a word of encouragement, a faith-filled gift, or simply by praying each day for those you hope will return to the practice of their faith. Each of us shares a real responsibility in handing on the faith. As a great friend of mine often said, "Do one thing—do something." Let us take that to heart as we begin this year, inviting those we love to encounter and trust in God's unconditional love.
