Dear Friends,

Growing up in Dundalk, St Brigid's Day has always held a special place in my calendar, just as St Brigid herself holds a special place in my heart. Born in Faughart, just outside Dundalk, around 450 AD, St Brigid is one of the co-patron saints of Ireland. Her shrine in Faughart—only a short distance from the M1 motorway—is visited daily by pilgrims, including many from our own parish who gather there each year on 15th August for our Vocations Mass.

There are close and beautiful connections between St Brigid and St Patrick. While St Patrick is credited with bringing the message of Jesus to a once-pagan land, St Brigid, through her care for the poor, the sick, the elderly, and through her deep connection to the land, showed people how to live the Christian life fully and authentically.

Many legends surround St Brigid's life and works, but what is clear is that she was filled with the courage of the Holy Spirit. She was a woman of deep conviction who recognised that the Ireland of her time could be a cold and heartless place, and that true fulfilment could only come through an understanding of God's love for each of us. Her message was simple yet powerful. Using rushes and reeds, she formed the Brigid's Cross to teach of Christ's sacrificial love—a love so great that Jesus gave his life for us.

St Brigid's message remains simple, yet profoundly challenging. She was a leader and a peacemaker who embodied generosity, compassion, and kindness. Nourished by God's grace, she lived her faith through service, bringing hope and healing to others, and handing on the greatest gift of all: God's love. In times of conflict, she chose peace; in a world of limits, she followed God's call with courage, breaking barriers and leading in ways made possible only through grace.

This weekend, we are invited to reflect on how we might model our lives on the great saints of our land—how, in simple and practical ways, we can be transformative within our families and communities. May we be courageous yet gentle, faithful yet joyful, leaders who serve with the humility of the apostles.
